## Autumn Term 2

#### Dear Parents

Welcome to the Autumn 2 term. We had a very busy end to the last half term with several events that were well attended by parents. Thank you for your contribution and support.

During the Black History assembly pupils shared a wealth of information about the important contribution black people have made to literature, architecture, music and politics in British society.

We were treated to several poetry recitals of Valerie Bloom from Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 pupils.

Mrs Pannell provided the Rosary breakfast for parents and pupils.

Year 6 presented a Harvest assembly to pupils and parents. They used role play, dance and song to explore two themes linked to Catholic Social Teaching - Option for the poor and Dignity. The Option for the Poor role play followed the 'See -Judge - Act' model - using the idea of learning about hunger in homes, judging what they could do and acting by collecting for a foodbank.

The Dignity role play was a reminder that we are all created in the image of God and therefore should love one another.

The assembly was very well received by all parents and pupils. After the assembly, we asked for some pupil voice. - one child wrote,

'My job as a Catholic is to have justice and help the poor. I can see people in tents or sleeping bags. I have to judge what food I can give. I act to see who I can help.'

We raised £163.95 in total for CAFOD, thank you for your support. It is not too late to make your contribution.

### November is the Month of Remembrance

Year 5 performed the Remembrance assembly for school and parents. The children delivered a beautiful Remembrance service. They acted, narrated, read poems, played in the orchestra and sang with great respect and dignity. The children helped us reflect and pray during the month of remembrance. We remember - we pray.









Each class prepared a poppy wreath which they laid at our Remembrance altar. Mrs Moore was very impressed with the children's reverence and respect throughout and especially during the period of silence.
