World Book Day 2024 Thursday 7th March

We are delighted to announce a series of events for World Book Day that will span the next 2~3 weeks.

Story Explorer Drama Workshops - Thursday 7th March

All classes from Reception to Year 6 will all receive a visit from 'West-End in schools' - This company provides professional West End Performers who will deliver Story Explorer Drama Workshops. By exploring children's books through drama, children have the chance to experience storytelling first-hand. Using techniques drawn from professional theatre, they will gain confidence alongside a new understanding of the characters and themes as they live and breathe the story. Reception, Years 1 and 2 will attend a workshop connected to the book 'We're going to find the Monster' by Malorie Blackman and Key Stage 2 connected to the novel 'Matilda' by Roald Dahl

Whole School Activities

Children will be asked to come to school as their favourite book character OR choose 3 items that explain their book. (For example red shoes, a witches hat and a stuffed lion for The Wizard of OZ) and we will all try to guess the title. During the day each child will have a chance to show their costume or props at our world book day parade. All classes will participate in a World Book Day live lesson from BBC Teach.

Class Activities

Each class will also discuss their favourite books and authors ~ we will have a variety of online lessons and virtual author story times

We will make time for -'drop everything and read!' sessions and explore a number of new authors and titles linked to our free World Book Day vouchers. These vouchers are given to all the pupils in the school and can be used in exchange for a selection of £1.00 books or towards another book of your choice. Please check this website for details

Each class will also have their own focus. For example, we have signed up to virtual author sessions. During this week Year 5 and 6 will visit EYFS and Key Stage 1 and be their storyteller for a session. They will share a favourite book from when they were young!

Parents in EYFS and Key Stage 1 are invited to visit Year 1 or 2 during the week of 4th March to share your favourite book with the class. You can of course share your book in your own language. Please see the class teacher at the gate to arrange.

Class teachers will set up the competition for their classes which may take the form of homework or classwork. We hope you all encourage your child to enter the competition.
