Dear parents,

I would like to welcome you all to Year 2. I am looking forward to teaching the class and will ensure that this year is full of opportunities for your child to develop. I will be teaching through an exciting topic-based curriculum, which should stimulate discussion and questioning at home and school.

Religion

For Religious Education we use the scheme 'The Way, the Truth and the Life'. This term, children will be learning about Chosen People and how we are all special. We will hear the stories of Moses, Abraham and Daniel and respond to these through Scripture.

Writing

We will be exploring stories with familiar settings, identifying characters, settings, and story language used by the author. As part of our topic the children will write stories, letters, reports, diary entries and eye witness accounts.

There will be a big focus on vocabulary and grammar when speaking, reading and writing. We will be looking at the four different sentence types: command, exclamation, statement and question. We will use interesting vocabulary to make our writing more exciting for the reader.

This term we will continue to follow our phonics programme. The children will also investigate and learn strategies to help with spelling. Children will learn to spell the common exception words for Year 2 and revise the Year 1 spelling list.

Reading

Reading is very important. Children only become good readers by reading daily and being read to.

Your child will continue to read high level texts and will be heard read by a member of staff at least once a week. The children will also get the opportunity to engage in a Guided Reading group once a week. In this session the teacher leads the children in reading, discussion, questions and answers. This is a great opportunity to discuss higher level reading skills. **We encourage pupils to read at home every night, preferably to an adult. Please sign, date and write a comment in the reading record. Please ensure that your child has his/her reading book and reading record in school every day.** Children will also take a book of their choice from our class library, this is to develop their reading skills and also develop a love of reading.

Topic

Our topic this term is 'Into the Forest' the curriculum map is attached to this letter. During the term we will be looking at Microhabitats in our school grounds, finding green spaces in our local area and looking at the artists Andy Goldsworthy and Georgia O'Keeffe. Please take a look at the curriculum map to give you an idea of our learning so that you can support your child at home.

Maths

This half term we will be studying different concepts and problem solving through:

- Number and place value
- Addition and subtraction
- Shape

Regular mental arithmetic tests will be given.

Pupils are expected to learn

- Number bonds to 10, 20 & 100.
- Multiplication tables and related division facts (x2, x5, x10, x3)

By the end of Year 2 children are expected to know and apply 2, 5, 10 & 3 times tables.

RHSE

This term the children will be looking at 'Me, my body and myself'. We will be discussing how we are unique and how to keep clean and healthy.

PE

PE is a very important part of our curriculum; children not only learn skills but also the link between exercise and a healthy lifestyle. The children should come to school wearing their PE kit - navy shorts, a white t-shirt, socks and black trainers, during the colder months children should wear navy tracksuit, white t-shirt and black trainers (no logos should be visible). For the Autumn term Year 2 have PE on Tuesday.

Homework

All homework will be given out on a Friday and collected the following Wednesday.

Maths will be based on what your child has learnt that week or what they will be learning the following week.

English will consist of up to ten spellings from the phonics this week and the Y1/2 common exception word list and a reading comprehension.

Mathletics: Up to six activities will be given weekly.

Religion will also be part of our homework.

Online safety

As part of safeguarding our pupils, online safety is a priority. All gadgets including mobile phones, tablets and iPads must have the relevant parental controls on them in order to prevent access to inappropriate material. If your child is exposed to any harmful material, it will impact their welfare. Please ensure that your child is only using age-appropriate forms of social media and gaming. The age restrictions are in place to protect them and maintain their wellbeing.

Keep watch of your child's screen time. It is up to us to help children balance their onscreen time and adopt a healthy digital diet. Too much time can have a negative impact on their wellbeing. You can visit
