Dear Parents/Carers,

I would like to welcome you all to Year 5. I am looking forward to teaching the class and will ensure that this year is full of opportunities for your child to develop in maturity and independence. Making sure your child progresses through the curriculum, whilst also maintaining steady emotional wellbeing is very important and this will continue to be a focus in our school. I will be teaching an exciting topic-based curriculum, which should stimulate discussion and questioning at home and school. We are very lucky to have a number of support teachers this year. Miss Rusha will be working with Year 5 as our class Teaching Assistant and will support different groups of pupils throughout the day. Miss Freeman will provide support lessons in Maths and Comprehension. Miss Freeman will also be leading the Spelling lessons this year and co-ordinating Nessy and Maths Seeds interventions.

Important Information

Please make sure your child has a water bottle - the drinking fountain has been converted so that pupils can refill water bottles.

Communication

We will endeavour to update our class learning page weekly, so that parents can see what is happening in class. One of the Year 5 team will be at the gate in the morning or afternoon if you have any questions, however you can also use the text service for general enquiries and one of the Year 5 team will contact you. For more complex questions please request a phone call or meeting via text or at the office.

<u>Homework</u>

I will give homework that deepens or consolidates learning from our lessons in school. I will also provide a 'knowledge organiser' for topics in History and Science. These are vocabulary/fact sheets that you can use with your child at home to help to develop their understanding. Timetable for homework will include:

Reading and Comprehension

Mrs Moore. Miss Freeman and Miss Rusha will be setting comprehension homework. Children will be given a **comprehension** homework booklet that they will need to bring into school on **Wednesdays** so that we can discuss answers in comprehension lessons together.

Please ensure your child reads each evening and writes any thoughts about their book as well as any unfamiliar words in their Reading Record regularly. Please support us by adding your comments and signature at least once a week. We have a list of key books that should be read before the end of Year 5 and your child will be encouraged to read these books at home. We also carefully choose our class novel to allow as much development of reading skills as possible. If your child is not reading fluently please hear them read daily.

<u>Maths</u>

Children will continue their Mathletics work. They will receive a login and password. Please let me know if you have difficulty accessing the program. I will set several tasks each week and check they have been completed every Friday.

Spellings

Spellings will be set on **Monday** by Miss Freeman, children will be asked to write extended, imaginative sentences from five of their spellings and also to find definitions of words. They will be tested on their spellings on **Monday**.

<u>RE</u>

Children will be given regular RE homework - such as learning specific prayers or hymns, research or written work. This is a very important part of your child's education and your support is much appreciated.

Other Homework

Sometimes children will be asked to develop a project at home as well as completing their regularly set homework. We will be using Google classroom this term and will assign some tasks for the children to practise. Let me know if you have technical difficulties. If your child finds any of the homework too hard, please make sure you see me as soon as possible.

<u>Online safety</u>

As part of safeguarding our pupils, online safety is a priority. All gadgets including mobile phones, tablets and iPads must have the relevant parental controls on them in order to prevent access to inappropriate material. If your child is exposed to any harmful material, it will impact their welfare. Please ensure that your child is only using age-appropriate forms of social media. The age restrictions are in place to protect them and maintain their wellbeing. As of May 2018, WhatsApp's minimum age of use is 16 years old. WhatsApp group chats in particular have caused upset and hurt. I urge you to restrict your child's use of this form of communication. Parents, please also be mindful of what you write on WhatsApp. Refrain from negatively mentioning anyone's name, particularly if it's a child you may be discussing. We all have a duty of care to all the children of the school.

Keep watch of your child's screen time. It is up to us to help children balance their onscreen time and adopt a healthy digital diet. Too much time can have a negative impact on their wellbeing. PE

PE Kits should be worn into school on the day of their lesson and the children can wear them all day. PE kit consists of white t shirt, navy shorts socks and plain trainers. In the colder months, navy tracksuits can be worn for outside activities (with shorts underneath in case the lesson is indoors.)

This term, PE will be on Tuesday. We will also be participating in the Daily Mile which will be 3 x a week. The children will run for up to 15 minutes - this will improve their fitness and stamina. They do not need to wear special kit or shoes for this activity.

<u>Chess</u>

We will have a Chess Tutor (Mr Costello) on Friday afternoons for 1 hour. Mr Costello will teach the children various chess strategies – chess is an excellent game to learn – promoting logic, patience and self-discipline.

Year 5 is a lovely class to teach, but the expectations for this year group are high. Your child may find it difficult at first, if you have any concerns about your child's learning or wellbeing please let me know as soon as possible
