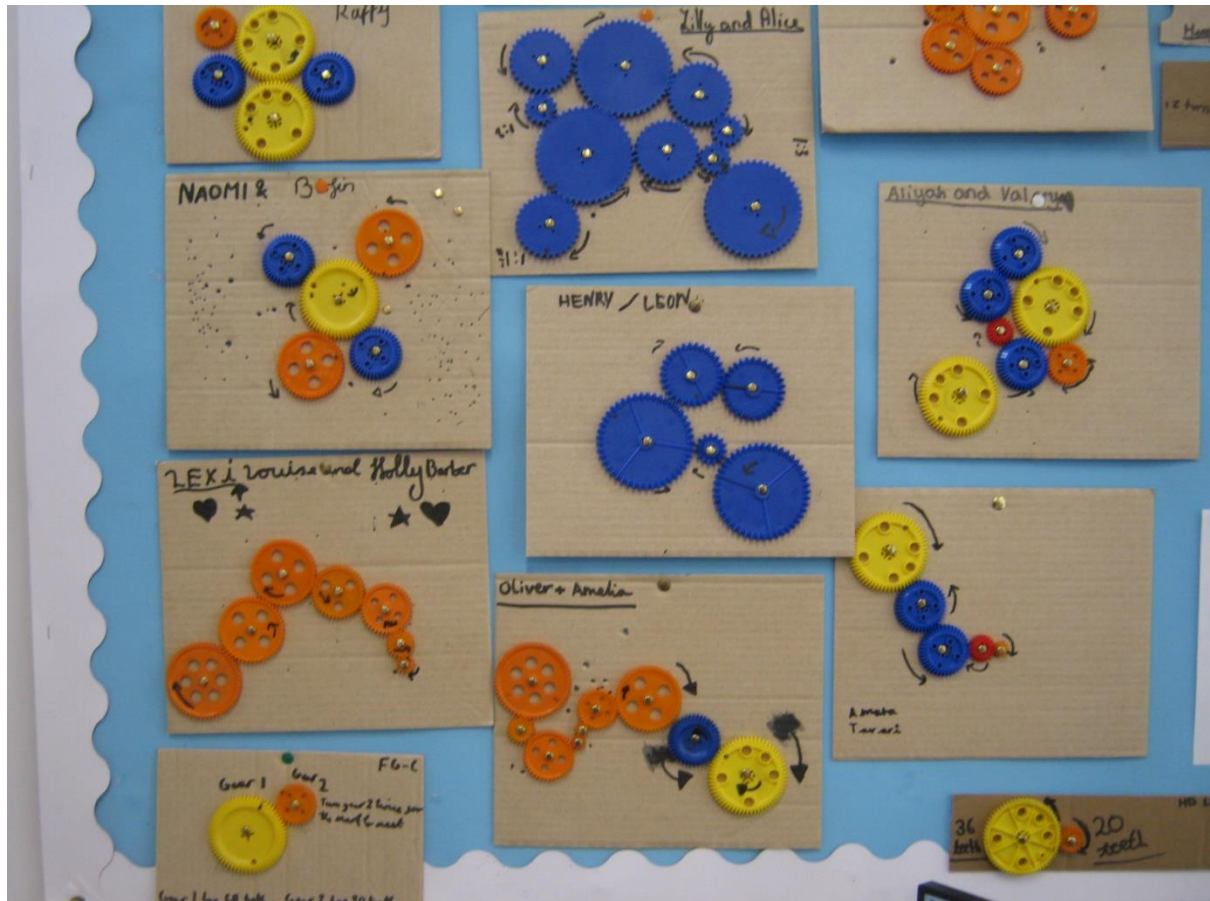
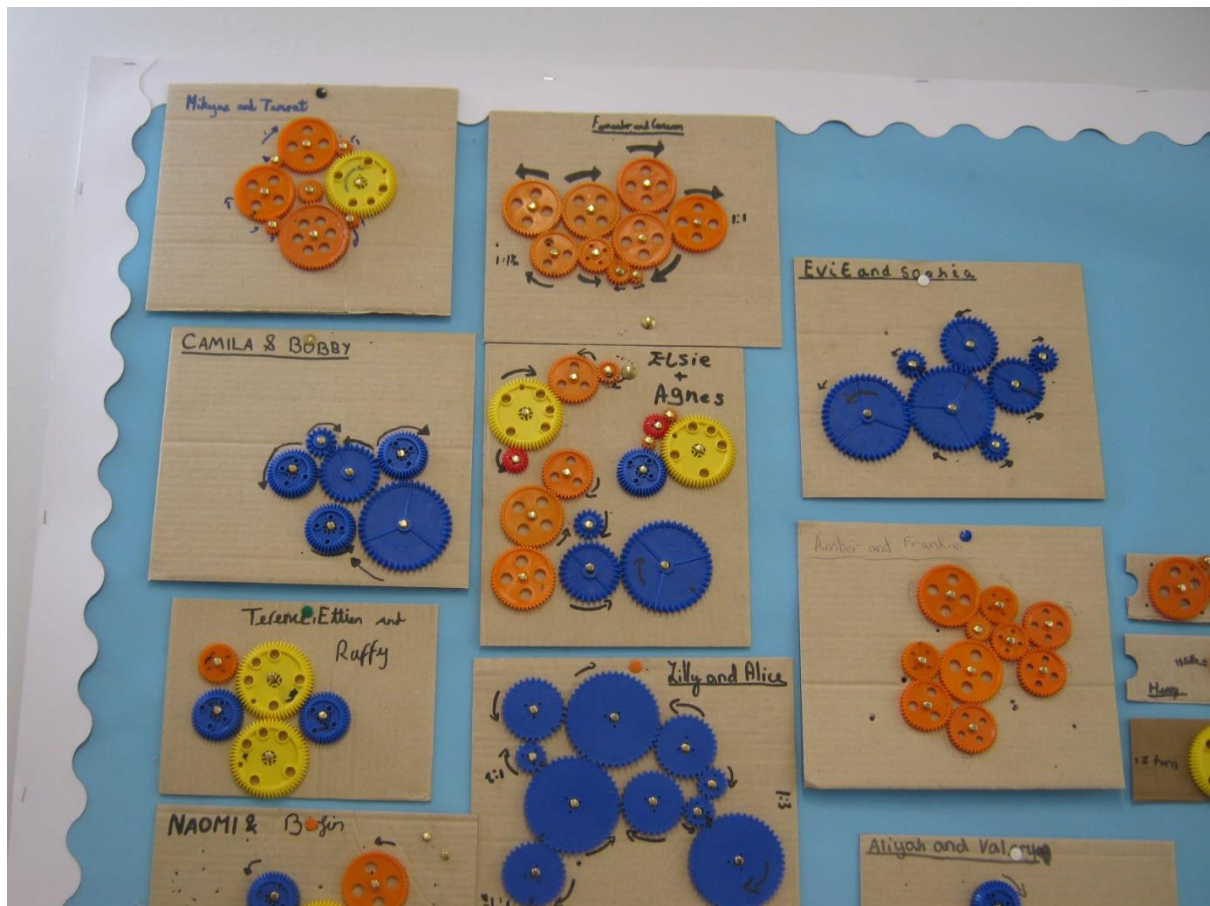
## Science – Magical Machines



We have learned about gears – the way they move and how different size gears affect each other.

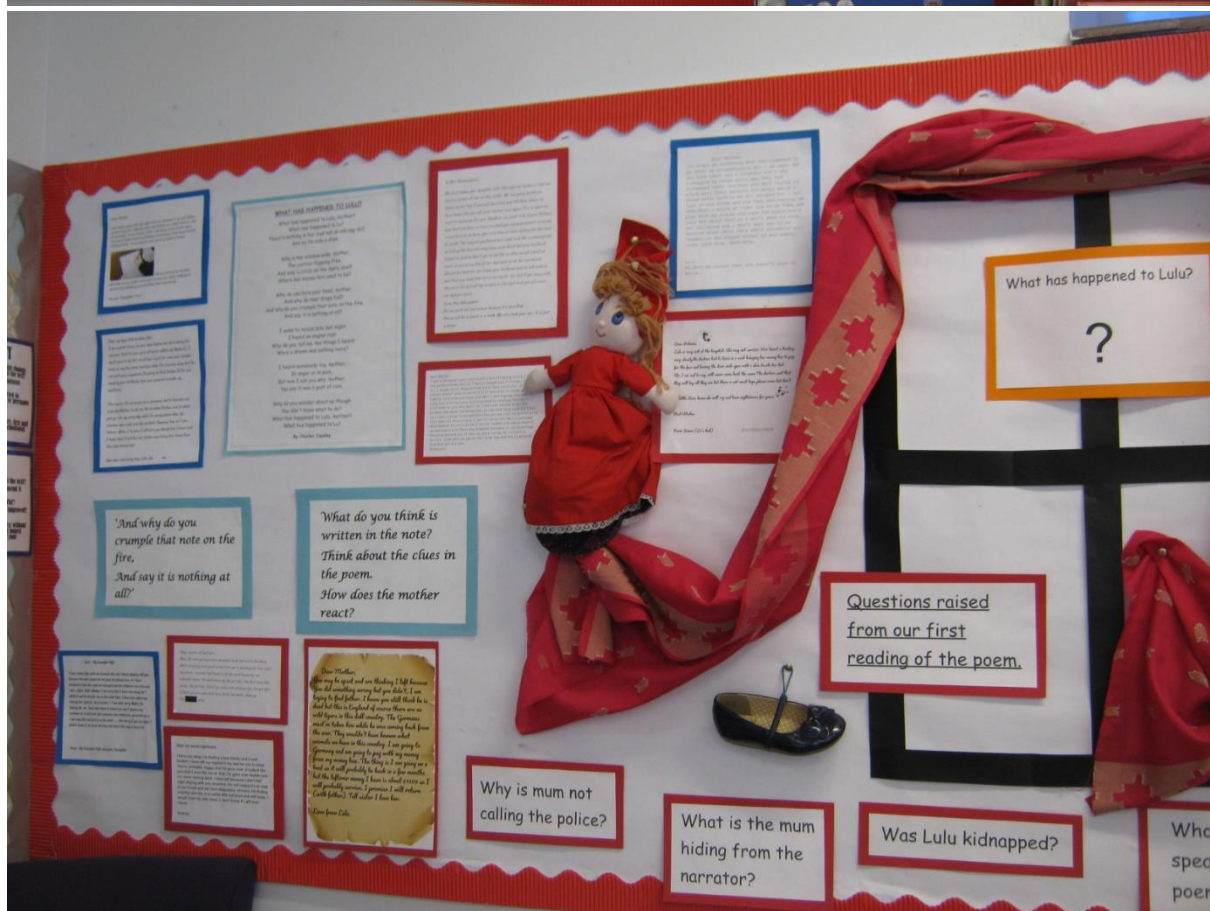
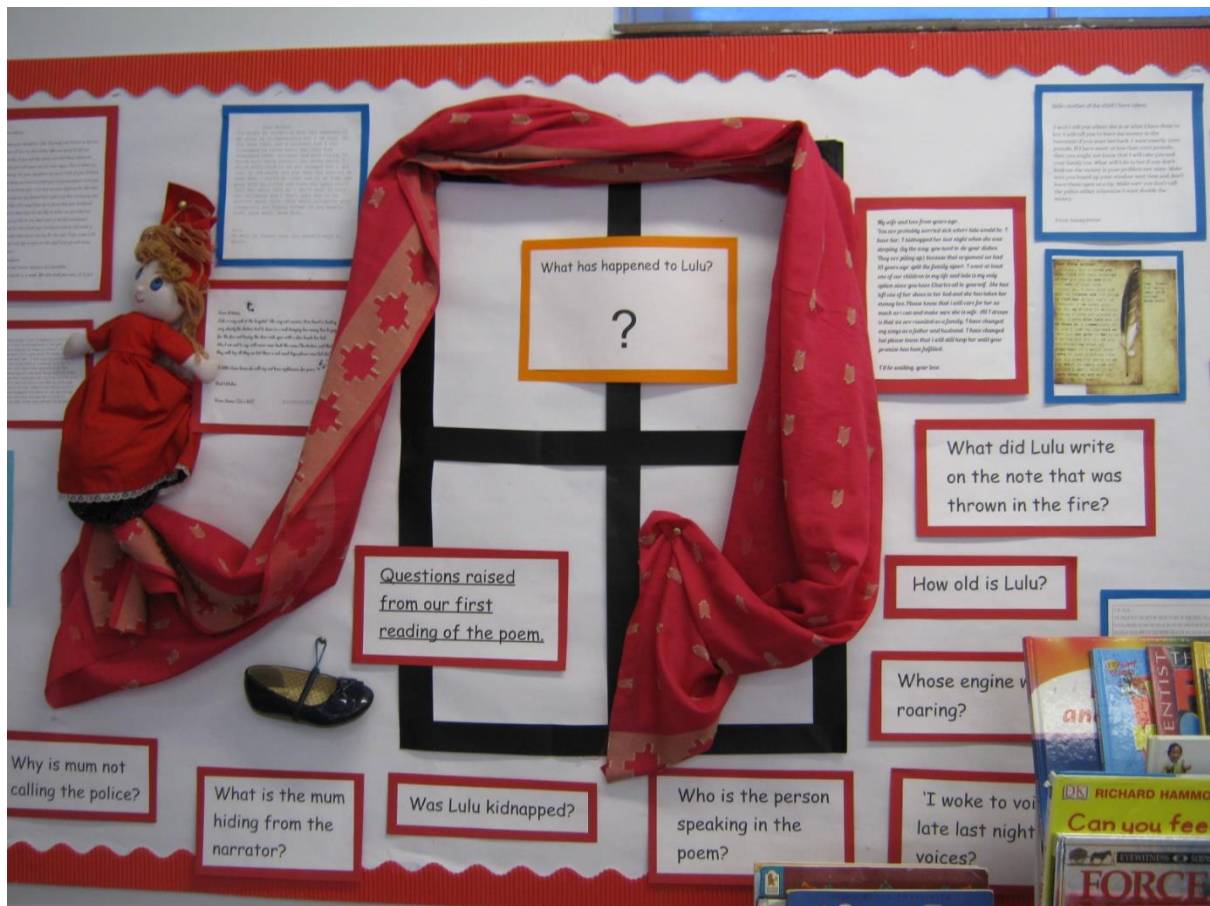
